### **SUMMARY**

May 2019 saw an decrease of 700 jobs compared with the same time period in 2018. While services providing industries including retail trade, information services, and state education led losses in jobs, goods producing, construction, educational and health service employment saw continued growth.



Anchorage's job market is still modestly rebounding. Our earlier prediction that we are nearing the end of the recession is coming true; however, this trend is very tenuous and could easily reverse as final decisions on the future of the state budget are made between the legislature and the administration.


### ANCHORAGE EMPLOYMENT

### **GOODS PRODUCING JOBS**










# CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT









### **SERVICES PROVIDING JOBS**

Services providing industries are down 1,200 jobs between May 2018 and May 2019.




# PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES








## ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME LISTINGS

# ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME MONTHLY UNIT SALES


### **MONTHLY 10-YEAR COMPARISON**






# ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME AVERAGE SALES PRICE

#### YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The average price of a single family home in Anchorage shrank to \$376,579 in May 2019 from \$377,478 in May 2018, compared to the highest price in the last decade in May 2015 at \$389,773. May 2019 is in line with May 2014 average home costs.

# SOUTHCENTRAL ALASKA UNEMPLOYMENT ANALYSIS (2019, YTD)

### **TAKEAWAY**

Unemployment rates in Anchorage have lowered 0.3% as we move into the summer season to 5.2% unemployment in May, the lowest unemployment rate in the southcentral region. In May 2019 there are 7,813 unemployed individuals compared to 8,367 in May of 2018.

Anchorage continues to show the lowest unemployment numbers in the southcentral region with Kenai coming in at 6.4% unemployment, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 6.9% unemployment and the State of Alaska as a whole at 6.2% unemployment for May 2019.
